## PAST EVENTS

After the events of November this month has been fairly quiet.

On the 2<sup>nd</sup> December at 1100 there was a wreath laying ceremony at the Memorial at North Corner dedicated to the North Corner Heroes. It was a moving event attended obviously mostly by former Royal Marines, as George Sheard was one of the "Cockleshell Heroes", under the command of Parade Marshall Richard Bendall BEM paying their respects to Brave men who paid the ultimate price and went on a mission knowing that could well be the case. Plymouth's Lord Mayor was there to represent the City and Basil Downing-Waite the Federation Chairman attended as did our Patron Cdr. Charles Crichton OBE. Wreaths were laid by The Lord Mayor of Plymouth, Plymouth RNA, the SBS and the family of George Sheard. The Steam Packet pub very generously laid on a buffet lunch for us all.



On Tuesday the 4<sup>th</sup> December at 1130 the funeral took place at Efford Crematorium of George Stone, Secretary of the Korean Veterans Association. As well as many Veterans from his Association, family members and friends, five Standards attended including the Korean Veterans Standard carried by Peter Clark. The Federation would like to thank those Standards who attend.

Monday the 31<sup>st</sup> December saw the regular service and wreath laying at the grave of George Hinkley VC in Ford Park Cemetery. As has become perfectly normal in the last months of 2012 it was sheeting down with rain so the service, with seven standards in attendance, was held in the very nice chapel in the cemetery. The service was conducted by the Rev. Peter Warland RN, chaplain to the RNA Plymouth, and the wreath was laid on the altar by the Great, Great, Great Grandson of George Hinkley, the still being sounded by Basil Downing-Waite. After the service some of those present made their way in the lashing rain to the grave where the wreath was laid on the grave. Afterwards over a welcome cup of tea and a small tot for some, John Whiteman thanked everyone who had attended.

This event has been taking place for the last ten years to honour George Hinkley and it is also the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the award of the VC to George in 1862 when he received the Victoria Cross for rescuing two colleagues under fire during an action in China. He was one of the first recipients on the medal as it had only been introduced about ten years earlier.
